"What does the term 'homegrown terrorism' mean? Is it useful?\_ "homegrown terrorism" (HGT) has proven to be a recurrent theme in political, academic and public discourses, yet has remained conceptually obscure. Nevertheless, starting with the phrasing itself, HGT carries both domestic and evolutionary implications, conveying both recognizable origins and a process of change. It can be a heavily emotive, pejorative expression, with connotations of betrayal and duplicity. [8] The core assumption of HGT is that the terrorists themselves are born and raised, or at least have a strong affiliation to the West,[9] but undergo a process of radicalization,[10] gradually adopting an extremist ideological framing.[11] Less immediately apparent, but potentially more strategically significant, is the notion of autonomy and self-determination in the act – HGT is often conceptualized as being conceived and carried out independently of any direct control or chain of command.[12] Some observers consider that being "native-born citizens" to the country attacked is the qualifying criteria for HGT.[13]" (Severs)


# Minimizing the Threat, Ignoring the Facts

## "How Much Danger Do We Face From Homegrown Jihadist Terrorist"?

"Perhaps the <u>most unusual thing</u> about the Boston Marathon bombing is that it happened at all. While we've seen all manner of terrorist bomb plots since September 11—the <u>Times Square bomber</u>, the <u>underwear bomber</u>, even the guys who fantasized about <u>destroying the Sears Tower</u>—all have been thwarted by the FBI, the perpetrators' own bumbling, <u>or both</u>" (Gilson).

I concur with Gilson, there are so many Homegrown Terrorist attacks, that are being called mass shootings, but in reality it's a form of a terrorist act. Look at Adam Lanza who fatally shot 20 children at an Elementary School in 2012, Lanza was born and raised in New Hampshire.


### "US Radicals Bigger Terror Threat Than Jihadist in America"

"Since the 9/11 attacks, many Americans have considered radical Muslims as the preeminent threat to homeland security. But non-jihadist extremists have been responsible for nearly twice the number of deaths as jihadist attacks in the United States, according to a count by New America, a Washington research center. Non-Muslim extremists have carried out 19 such attacks since Sept. 11, 2001, killing 48 people, according to the report. In contrast, self-proclaimed Muslim extremists, such as Fort Hood shooter Nidal Malik Hasan, killed 26 people in seven attacks in the same time period" (Simon)

I concur with Simon, look at the right wing extremists, such as white supremacists, and anti-government crusaders, who have killed twice as many as did the radical Muslims. And they have also been around a lot longer, than the radicals. We as Americans need to be more educated on just what Homegrown Terrorist really is, and we also need to know what is in our own back yards.

#### TERRORISTS AT HOME

Since Sept. 11, 2001, the New American Foundation has cataloged 19 deadly attacks by non-jihadist extremists, compared to seven by jihadists.

"Timothy McVeigh the Oklahoma City Bombing is showed the U.S. Vulnerability to domestic terrorism. The greatest threat of large-scale attacks come from individuals and small groups of extremists who subscribe to radical Islamic or far right-wing ideologies, said Gary LA Free, director of the National Consortium for the Study of Terrorism and Responses to Terrorism, or START" (CNN) Looks like the boy next door.

"To hear his neighbors tell it, Daniel Boyd is one of the most upstanding citizens of Willow Springs, North Carolina. "If he's a terrorist, he's the nicest terrorist I ever met in my life," a 39-year-old drywall contractor, was arrested on July 27 — along with six others, including his twenty-something sons, Dylan and Zakariya — for allegedly plotting "violent jihad" overseas. According to the indictment, Boyd has spent the past three years stockpiling weapons in his rural home, recruiting and training would-be suicide bombers and orchestrating trips to Gaza, Israel, Jordan and Kosovo to scout potential attack sites". 
